

From the Rector

2022 represented recovery and adaptation with so much to celebrate! As the Vestry recently looked at attendance numbers for 2022 when you combine both in-person and online numbers, we were at higher levels than pre-pandemic. People are engaging in our community in a variety of new ways yet to be fully understood. There are many doors into our community with worship at the center of what we do. Many of our recent courses, even for newcomers, are online or hybrid, as it has been discovered that people often share more deeply when they are in the comfort of their own homes. Vestry meetings have a hybrid component that allows our members to attend virtually as well. The capacity to be a full participant in leadership and study groups wherever we are is a revelation. It is not uncommon that we meet people for the first time months after they have been attending online; or we are able to pastorally support a funeral or wedding for a loved one. Of course, it's really helpful to see each other in person, but it's not the only way we are the body of Christ.

In 2022, so many good roots grew that are preceding outward signs of change. Thanks to all of you we were able to retire most of the remainder of the debt from the Ministry Center this year. We are now down to a mere \$250,000 already after starting last May with \$800,000 in debt, due to our highly participatory "Growing our Faith, Family and Future: Celebrate 125 Years!" capital campaign. Your contributions and pledges of \$1.25 million for our 125th Anniversary are allowing for not only complete debt retirement ahead of schedule but also creating an opportunity for solarization, new choir room and a needed capital equipment replacement fund. So much good work has been done on both efforts, soon to be realized in actual changes to our campus. Thanks to our campaign team of Kevin Reynolds, Kari Govan, Jason Crum, David Grove, Suzie Garrod, and Peggy Miller along with Kirby-Smith Associates we have more than met our original goals well ahead of schedule.

The adaptations and recovery meant we could finally return to choir rehearsals, our choristers' program could recommence, we could celebrate with a Spaghetti Gala "SpaGala" 125 years of ministry, continue to support our Afghan families, make new friends through our shared Iftar and Turkish Early Thanksgiving events with the American Turkish Friendship Society (ATFA). Our Hypothermia Shelter returned to on-campus presence supporting those who are in need of housing. Pennywise has never been stronger, thriving in its new location, supporting ministry within and beyond the church. Due to the leadership of Linda Meyers, and our Preschool board, our Preschool is extremely healthy with waiting lists for enrollments. Our ministry with FACETS continues with youth and adults serving those who struggle economically.

After waiting two years we were finally able share in a mission trip with our confirmation class going to Puerto Rico this past June, and our youth ministry programs continue to be vital places of conversation and learning and service. Our children's programs for our youngest members are remarkable in their substance. Our choirs inspire us weekly and more often with Sunday worship and Evensongs, each member reminding us to use our gifts to the glory of God. Adult Formation has never had so many outstanding offerings thanks to Norma Williamson who shares this ministry with the Rev. Ann Gillespie and others.

This past fall we were able to add back in a third service at 11:15 a.m. on Sundays, held in the chapel until it is ready to return to the sanctuary with sufficient numbers to continue to attract people. At 80% of regularly-filled seating capacity, we will move back into the sanctuary. A worship space that is regularly less than 50% full usually doesn't feel inviting to new attendees. I am grateful we have the chapel worship space as an "incubator" for keeping our community growing.

Your ideas and inspirations make our community grow. Your efforts to show up, and make commitments and to foster a life of faith with others is a blessing. Thank you for all the ways you make the body of Christ in this place. Do come, show up, learn to love the people you meet here, as they will love and care for you in ways that strengthen the sense of presence of the One who loves us and calls us to a life of love.

Recently, a parishioner compared our preaching team to the 1927 Yankees baseball team which was very kind. I would say that we have an "All-Star" lineup with our whole staff at Holy Comforter, people whose first instinct is to use their gifts to serve God and love all those around them. It is freeing and energizing to work with such talented, creative, thoughtful servant leaders: I give thanks for The Rev. Ann Gillespie, our Sr. Associate; The Rev. Jackie Thomson, our Pastoral Associate; Peggy Miller, our Parish Administrator; Liz Bleich our Assistant Administrator; Dr. David Kelley, our Music Minister; Brynn Pacitti, our Director of Children's Formation; Denis McMullen, our Youth Minister; Elvs McLean, our Communications Director; Tom Gaddell, our Facilities Manager; Victor Hernandez, our Sexton, and Leila and Roya, who support our nursery. Each bring an integrity and vitality that is tremendous.

Our lay leadership at Holy Comforter regularly amaze me in the ways they serve with cheerfulness and consideration. This past year Jason Crum and Suzie Garrod were exceptional in their faithfulness as our Sr. and Jr. Wardens along with our whole Vestry. There is a spirit of collaboration and prayerful intention

Beth, my wife, is a regular inspiration to me, and to many in our community, bringing a depth of thoughtfulness and wisdom too great to be counted. It is a joy to share life together.

Keep praying and thinking about how we can better serve together and strengthen the presence of Christ here. May we continue to form more and more the beloved community God dreams about in us.






