People Love and loyalty to Christ, who gives us the gospel. Praise to Christ who calls us to holiness.



FORGIVENESS [All kneel.]

The Presider says

We come seeking forgiveness for all we have failed to be and do as members of Christ's body. [All keep silence.]

The Presider continues

In God there is forgiveness.

People Loving and all-seeing God, forgive us where we have failed to support one another and to be what we claim to be. Forgive us where we have failed to serve you; and where our thoughts and actions have been contrary to yours we ask your pardon.

Presider God forgives us; be at peace. [All keep silence.]

Rejoice and be glad, for Christ is resurrection, reconciliation for all the human race.

People We shall all be one in Christ, one in our life together. Praise to God who has created us, praise to God who sends us into the world.

THE SENTENCE OF THE DAY

One thing I have asked of the Lord, which I long for: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze on your beauty O Lord: and to seek you in your temple.

THE COLLECT OF THE DAY

God of glory, you gave the vision of your Son to those who watched on the mountain; grant that by our glimpses of him we may be changed into his glorious likeness; for he is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever. **Amen.**

THE WORD OF GOD

THE FIRST LESSON [The people are seated.]

Exodus 24:12-18

The Lord said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction." So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. To the elders he had said, "Wait here for us, until we come to you again; for Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them." Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. The glory of the Lord settled on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it for six days; on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the cloud. Now the appearance of the glory of the Lord was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the people of Israel. Moses entered the cloud, and went up on the mountain. Moses was on the mountain for forty days and forty nights.

The Second Lesson 2 Peter 1:16-21

We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain. So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

THE HOLY GOSPEL Matthew 17:1-9

The Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Praise and glory to God.

Six days after Peter had acknowledged Jesus as the Christ, the Son of the living God, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his face

shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!" When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Get up and do not be afraid." And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone. As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, "Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

This is the Gospel of Christ.

Praise to Christ, the Word.

THE SERMON The Rev. Jackie Thomson

A brief period of silence is observed for reflection on the sermon. The people stand for the Affirmation of Faith.

THE AFFIRMATION OF FAITH [Said by all.]

You, O God, are supreme and holy. You create our world and give us life. Your purpose overarches everything we do. You have always been with us. You are God.

You, O God, are infinitely generous, good beyond all measure. You came to us before we came to you. You have revealed and proved your love for us in Jesus Christ, who lived and died and rose again. You are with us now. You are God.

You, O God, are Holy Spirit. You empower us to be your gospel in the world. You reconcile and heal; you overcome death.

You are our God. We worship you.

The Presider says

Let us pray for the Church and for the world, giving thanks for God's goodness. [All remain standing.]

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

The leader and people pray responsively. Particular intercessions and thanksgivings may be offered before any section. Periods of silence may be kept.

Intercessor Blessed are you eternal God,

People to be praised and glorified for ever.

Intercessor Heavenly Father, hear us as we pray for the unity of the Church.

People May we all be one that the world may believe.

Intercessor Grant that every member of the Church may truly and humbly serve you,

People that the life of Christ may be revealed in us.

Intercessor We remember those who have died.

People Father, into your hands we commend them.

Intercessor We praise you for all your saints who have entered your eternal glory.

People May we also come to share your heavenly kingdom.

Intercessor Have compassion on those who suffer from sickness, grief or trouble.

People In your presence may they find strength.

Intercessor Look with your kindness on our homes and families.People Grant that your love may grow in our hearts.

Intercessor Make us alive to the needs of our community.

People Help us to share one another's joys and burdens.

Intercessor Inspire and lead those who hold authority in the nations of the world.

People Guide us and all people in the way of justice and peace.

Intercessor Strengthen all who minister in Christ's name.

People Give us courage to proclaim your Gospel.

Intercessor We pray in silence for our own needs. [A period of silence is kept.]

The Presider proceeds

God our hope, may your blessing empower our thanksgivings and our prayer; for we put our trust in you the living God, risking disappointment, risking failure, working and waiting expectantly. **Amen.**

THE PEACE

Presider Blessed be Christ the Prince of Peace

People who breaks down the walls that divide.

Presider The peace of God be always with you.

Praise to Christ who unites us in peace.

The people greet one another with a sign of God's peace and are then seated.

THE PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

The people remain seated while an offering is received to support Holy Comforter's work of sharing God's love with the world. As the offering is brought forward to the altar, all stand.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING [The people stand.]

Presider Christ is risen!

He is risen indeed.

Presider Lift your hearts to heaven

where Christ in glory reigns.

Presider Let us give thanks to God.

People It is right to offer thanks and praise.

The Presider proceeds

It is the joy of our salvation, God of the universe, to give you thanks through Jesus Christ.

You said, 'Let there be light'; there was light. Your light shines on in our darkness. For you the earth has brought forth life in all its forms.

You have created us to hear your Word, to do your will and to be fulfilled in your love. It is right to thank you.

You sent your Son to be for us the way we need to follow and the truth we need to know.

His star, mysterious and inviting, calls us to worship the Christ who is born. For he is Emmanuel, God revealed in human form for all the human race; to him we offer our homage and our gifts.

You sent your Son to give his life to release us from our sin. His cross has taken our guilt away.

You send your Holy Spirit to strengthen and to guide, to warn and to revive your Church. Therefore, with all your witnesses who surround us on every side, countless as heaven's stars, we praise you for our creation and our calling, with loving and with joyful hearts:

SANCTUS [Said by all.]

Holy God, holy and merciful, holy and just, glory and goodness come from you. Glory to you most high and gracious God.

The Presider proceeds

Blessed are you, most holy, in your Son, who washed his disciples' feet. 'I am among you,' he said, 'as one who serves.'

On that night before he died he took bread and gave you thanks. He broke it, gave it to his disciples, and said: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me.

After supper, he took the cup, and gave you thanks. He gave it to them and said: Drink this. It is my blood of the new covenant, shed for you, shed for all, to forgive sin; do this to remember me.

MEMORIAL ACCLAMATION

Presider Therefore, with this bread and wine we recall your goodness to us.

People God of the past and present, we your people remember your Son.

We thank you for his cross and rising again, we take courage from his ascension; we look for his coming in glory and in him we give ourselves to you.

The Presider continues

Send your Holy Spirit, that we who receive Christ's body may indeed be the body of Christ, and we who share his cup draw strength from the one true vine.

People Called to follow Christ, help us to reconcile and unite. Called to suffer, give us hope in our calling.

Presider For you, the heavenly one, make all things new; you are the beginning and the end, the last and the first.

People Praise, glory and love be yours, this and every day, from us and all people, here and everywhere. Amen.

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

Presider Christ's body was broken for us on the cross.

People Christ is the bread of life.

Presider His blood was shed for our forgiveness.

People Christ is risen from the dead.

Presider Come God's people, come to receive Christ's heavenly food.

Invitation [The People are seated.]

As Jesus welcomed all to his table, so do we at Holy Comforter. The bread and the wine are the central symbols of God's presence and we invite you to share in the Eucharist in whatever way feels comfortable to you, regardless of age or tradition. We also offer gluten-free bread and unfermented grape juice as alternatives—just let the priest know. If you prefer to receive a blessing, cross your arms in front of your chest. The Holy Eucharist is an outward and visible sign of an inward and spiritual grace, a mutual indwelling of Christ in us and us in him. Come to the table and be joined into Christ's ministry of love and reconciliation.
