

CELEBRATIONS!

- From October 2022 through December 2023 we have hosted 12 blood drives, collecting 427 units of blood, helping nearly 1,500 people.
- The blood drives attract people from the local community to the church.
- Every drive has been staffed by wonderful volunteers who welcome donors.
- Our blood drive—the only one in Vienna—has filled a void for the Red Cross.

HOPES

Expanding advertising of the drives beyond the *Comfortable Word*, Facebook, Patch, and NextDoor in order to broaden our reach within the community and attract donors, increasing the units of blood collected and people helped.

Building & Grounds



CELEBRATIONS!

- Replaced the aging Sanctuary air conditioner with a new unit that is quieter and more energy efficient.
- Painted the wood trim of the church building and replaced areas of rotting wood.
- Created a uniform Wi-Fi system within the church building.
- Continued to remove invasive and non-native plants on the church grounds and expand our network of walking trails.

HOPES

- To continue to work on our grounds by removing invasive species, removing trash and debris, and expanding its trail network.
- To refresh our signage, with a new face for our large sign on Beulah Road, new parking lot signs, and new signs in the Narthex.
- To complete our solar energy project, which will reduce our carbon footprint and lower our energy costs.
- To continue to conserve energy and improve our control over our heating and air conditioning.



Children's Ministries



CELEBRATIONS!

- Led a Thanksgiving food collection to benefit a family in need through Fairfax County Family Services.
- Faith in Action (FIA) class assisted with our monthly FACETS meal preparation, sponsored coffee hour, and raised over \$300 to support Five Talents.
- Sunday School teachers led our 4 classrooms with skill, warmth, and humor.
- Additional volunteers assisted with special classes and programs.
- 3 parish-wide events: Pumpkin, Potluck, & Prayer; Advent Wreath Making; and Gingerbread Extravaganza.
- Attendance at Christmas children's services was up (301 at the 11 a.m. service; 395 at the 4 p.m. service).
- Worked on improving our 2nd Saturday Church as a way for families and children to engage more actively in worship. Attendance has grown steadily.



Although we have a wonderful group of engaged families, we would love to welcome more to join our community in whatever way supports their families and spiritual lives. This goal will require a renewed focus on communication both within and outside the parish and collaboration with other ministries to support families in a holistic way. We also do not want to overburden our long-term volunteers

and are working on ways to add additional volunteers for tasks including event preparation, craft and activity preparation, and occasional in-class assistance.

CELEBRATIONS!

- Spread over 30 cubic yards of wood chips, to suppress weeds (mostly Stiltgrass and lesser Celandine).
- Removed a lot of trash from the forest.
- Cleared a lot of invasive plants, starting at the edge of the parking lot, and moving downhill into the forest.
- Worked with the Preschool science teacher to teach students about composting.



HOPES

- Present an Earth Day event on April 21.
- Continue work on the Meadow.
- Supervise some Eagle Scout projects.
- Continue invasive plant removal, and planting of trees.

- An important mission of the ECW is support for funeral receptions held at the church. In 2023, volunteers did a significant job at both small and large events to set up the room, serve food and drink, and clean up. The ECW hosted about 15 funeral receptions.
